Heavy Machine Operations Apprenticeship Readiness Pathway

Organization: Minnesota Virtual Academy, in partnership with International Union of Operating Engineers Local 49 Service area: Statewide Industry sector: Construction

A program that offers virtual courses from all over Minnesota to prepare students to enter a registered apprenticeship training program to become a journey worker in the construction industry. Operating engineers work as heavy equipment operators, mechanics, or surveyors. They work with a variety of construction equipment such as cranes, bulldozers, excavators, forklifts, front end loaders, and backhoes. The program is offered to high school students in grades 9-12 who attend public school in Minnesota. The student is eligible to receive high school credit, articulated college credit and credit toward the IUOE Local 49 registered apprenticeship program upon completing courses. **Partners:** Minnesota Virtual Academy and International Union of Operating Engineers (Local 49)

YOUTH (16-24)

Youthbuild

A paid experiential learning opportunity through the Youthbuild program that offers specialized training for youth and young adults between the ages of 16 and 24 who are at risk of not completing high school. Participants are trained in construction and basic carpentry, work readiness skills, safety and leadership. They also receive construction-based work experience which results in affordable housing and building projects benefiting the community. Many youth receive industry-recognized construction credentials and OSHA 10 certificates. Graduates receive placement assistance in the building trades and related fields.
